Summary of Presentation

We are living at a time when the world seems to be ruled by money, and in many cases with a brutal will for power. Business interferes in politics, politics (ab)uses business, politicians and businesses seem to be able to buy influence as they see fit. Money and Power widely do not respect ethics, and don't even bother with the construction of ideologies.

In contrast to this disappointing picture however, a broad movement for diversity and sustainability has grown throughout civil societies in many areas and regions, setting up self sustainable structures and communities in many good examples. All of these movements are visible and potentially available to the global community these days. Communication and Information has become accessible through technology to **everyone willing to listen.**

Referring to our INWES president, the question is: which are the choices in this respect we need to make as individuals, as women in Science and Engineering, and how can we choose our roles? Science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) are critical fields for tackling the challenges for society as well as for the pure existence of mankind and society.
